HHA Meets Mrs. O at the White House

Hampstead Hill sets the standard for integrating food education and nutrition programming in school. We have Chrissa Carlson, our full-time Food Educator, daily Food for Life classes in a kitchen classroom, an organic garden, garden club, culinary arts club, community dinners prepared by guest chefs working with our kids, and healthy food at every staff and parent meeting.

In recognition of our commitment to healthy eating, First Lady Michelle Obama invited 30 Hampstead Hill students to a special CNN event at the White House. The event was televised live to more than 35,000 classrooms nationwide. It highlighted the First Lady's "Let's Move" initiative to end childhood obesity and featured student questions from the audience and from around the country.

Beginning Monday, May 3, 2010, students in grades 1-8 will take reading and math tests called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP). Each student will have the chance to score higher than they did in the fall. Any progress will be rewarded with a little treat. When students meet their target score, they will receive an ice cream sandwich.

Students do not need to study for these tests of academic progress. All the learning has already taken place. One tip for all students is to TAKE THEIR TIME. About one minute per question is usually an indication that students are putting forth enough effort. Trying hard really does result in higher scores. Rushing through the test will mean a lower score.

The tests are given on the computer with the teacher and test monitors present. MAP tests are unique in that they adapt to be appropriate for your child's level of learning. As a result,

each student has the same opportunity to succeed. The results of the May tests will be compared to the results of the tests in the fall to determine academic growth. You will receive information on your child's performance in the coming weeks.

Student Uniform Policy

As the weather gets warmer, students need to be reminded to dress appropriately for school. A collared navy blue shirt and tan shorts or pants are required. Jeans are not permitted. Skirts should be to the knee. Skorts and shorts must not be shorter than where the fingers rest at the side. No clothing should be ripped or too revealing. Also, it is our policy and BCPSS policy that students shall not wear excessive and distracting jewelry. Piercings other than small earrings are not permitted. Nose piercings should be maintained with a clear stud, not jewelry. Thank you for helping us to maintain a studious,

academic and professional appearance at school.

May is my favorite month. It is the month when we can start enjoying food grown in Maryland, whether picked from a backyard, school or community garden, or purchased at a farmer's market. The Sunday farmer's market downtown (under I-83) is a great family outing that will inspire the veggie lovers in all of us. Keep in mind that tomatoes and other summer favorites are still two months away. Spring brings us beautiful leafy greens, crispy roots and sweet peas. Salads never taste as good as they do in the spring, when lettuce is sweet and tender. Here is a favorite salad dressing recipe. Students in Food for Life enjoy this on a baby spinach salad.

Recipe of the Month

Honey Dijon Vinaigrette

Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup apple-cider vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1-2 teaspoons honey
- 1/4 cup olive oil
